WHY EIGHT? The most "popular" question about Chanukah is, "Why is Chanukah eight days long and not seven days? If the jug of oil that was found contained enough oil for one day's worth, then the miracle was that it lasted an extra seven days?" There are many many answers to this question, but perhaps the most basic and important answer is the fact that oil, a liquid, not only doesn't extinguish fire, but rather maintains fire. 
